Completing full-length digital SAT practice tests in Bluebook™ is associated with higher SAT scores. Students who completed 1, 2, or 3+ full-length practice tests scored roughly 25, 45, and 60 points higher, respectively, than similar SAT test takers who did not complete any full-length digital practice tests in Bluebook.
